# You're Invited to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Fall Native Plant Sale Hosted by the Appalachian Audubon Society

Saturday, September 13, 2008 Meadowood Nursery 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

It's time once again for our Annual AAS Fall Native Plant Sale at Meadowood Nursery, just north of Hummelstown. The fall sale offers over 300 species of native wildflowers, grasses, shrubs, vines and trees for purchase. Native plants are *the* landscaping plants of choice for people that want to attract birds and wildlife to their backyard and create a healthier environment. Native species, unlike imported species, are a part of the ecosystem and as such, support a complex web of living organisms which are interdependent and help to keep nature in balance. Early fall is an excellent time to plant, as roots have time to get established while the ground is warm and the air is cool. Meadowood Nursery is usually open by appointment only, so this is a great chance to visit the nursery without making special arrangements.

# In addition to great plants, this year we will have free refreshments for our shoppers, as well as the following special activities:

9:30 – 10:30 a.m. Bird Walk around the Meadowood property with Jane Earle. We'll check out the birds in the woods, meadows, & backyard and look at the plant communities that attract and support them. Bring your binoculars.

11:00 A.M. Steve Saffier, Audubon at Home Coordinator for Audubon PA, will speak about gardening for wildlife and the new Bird Habitat Recognition program.

#### DIRECTIONS TO MEADOWOOD NURSERY AT 24 MEADOWOOD DRIVE, HUMMELSTOWN:

<u>From the north:</u> take Route 81 to Exit 77. Proceed south/east on Route 39 approximately 3 miles and turn right on Red Top Road. Proceed 1 mile and turn right on Long Lane Drive. Take the first left onto Meadowood Drive and at the "Y" at the end of the road, stay to the left and take the drive on the left up the hill to the nursery. Follow signs and directions for parking.

<u>From the south:</u> follow signs to Hershey Park. From Hershey Park Drive in front of the Giant Center, follow Route 39 north/west approximately 3 miles and turn left on Red Top Road. Proceed 1 mile and turn right on Long Lane Drive to the first left onto Meadowood Drive. Proceed as above.

Meadowood Nursery is located in a residential neighborhood. Thank you for using caution while traveling through the area.

## Giant and Weis Gift Card Program Fundraiser

Our chapter will once again be selling Giant and Weis Gift cards at face value at our monthly meetings and club events. Members can purchase either card with cash or a check for the full face value, and our chapter gets back 5% of the value of the card, which we can then use for our education and conservation initiatives. Here's an example. You write a check to AAS for \$100 and receive a \$100 grocery gift card. At the check-out, all you have to do is swipe the card and the grocery purchase price is deducted from the value of the card. No pin numbers to remember, no names to sign, no ID required. Appalachian Audubon gets \$5 for every \$100 you spend. It adds up!

Giant gift cards can now be used for Giant gasoline, too, by pressing the "Credit Card" option and swiping the gift card at the pump. With the price of gas now, the 5% back to AAS <u>really</u> adds up fast! We all buy groceries and gasoline anyway, so wouldn't you rather have \$5.00 of every hundred you spend go to help birds and the environment? 
